





#### A Local Look at Raving Rollercoasters


Do you love to get your adrenaline pumping? Do you love going to theme parks? If so, you are probably one of the millions of Americans who love roller coasters. Most roller coasters are pulled by gravity, engines, and chains. They usually always start with a large hill, the highest on the entire ride. From that hill, they get the momentum they need to power them. through the rest of the ride. The home of the first roller coaster in the world was Paris. Paris had the very first wheeled vehicles on tracks as amusement park rides around 1912. Since then, roller coasters have been getting much faster, longer, and taller. Most older coasters were made of wood, but today's are made of steel. You can still find a few wooden coasters today at our local amusement park, Kennywood. The Jack Rabbit and The Racer are both older wooden coasters that have withstood the test of time. *The Racer* was built in 1910, and the Jack Rabbit was built in 1921. One of the coolest and newest roller coasters in the world is the *Valravn*, located at Cedar Point in Sandusky, Ohio: At its highest point, it is 223 feet, zooms past at 75 miles per hour, and is 3,412 feet long. It boasts the longest dive in the world:

What's your favorite memory as a child?


• Going on the Washington Trips as a student.




## The Atrocious Operation of ISIL: Nenous Thabit's Mission to Restore Destroyed Relics


(Left) Nenous Thabit shows one of his recreations after ISIL destroyed the ancient city of Nimrud (right.)


## The Election's End Means a New Beginning


As the presidential election season comes to a close, the new presidentelect, Donald J. Trump, has to face a greatly divided nation. Here, in Beaver



#### **A Historical World Series**


